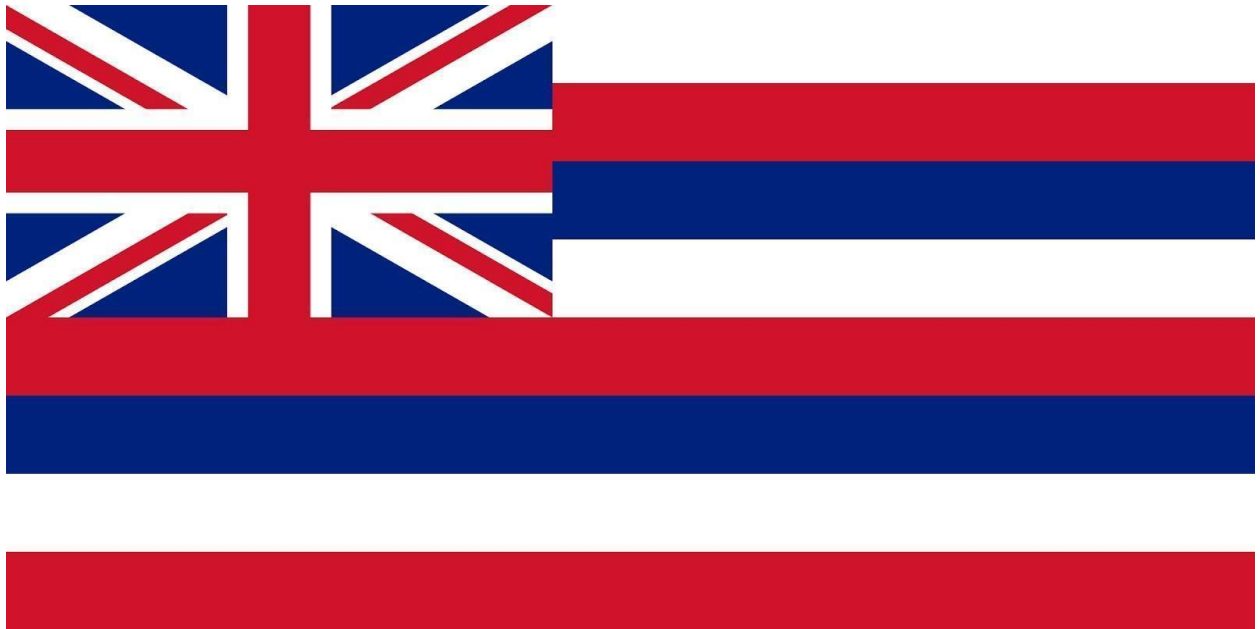

Bylaws as of Sep 16, 2023, in English

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HAWAIIAN PATRIOTIC LEAGUE OF HONOLULU

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ARTICLE I - NAME

Section 1. Name. The name of this Organization shall be the [HAWAIIAN PATRIOTIC LEAGUE OF HONOLULU](#) (Hui Aloha 'Aina o Honolulu), hereinafter referred to as HAA Honolulu.

Section 2. Date Organized. The founding date of HAA Honolulu is October 8, 2016.

Section 3. Location. The office, mailing address, physical address, and meetings of HAA Honolulu shall be in Honolulu, O'ahu.

Section 4. Alignment. HAA Honolulu shall operate in conformity with these bylaws, as well as the constitution and bylaws of the [Hawaiian Patriotic League](#) (Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Aina).

Section 5. Internet. The domain name and website location for HAA Honolulu shall be [www.haahonolulu.org](#). The associated contact e-mail address shall be [haahonolulu@gmail.com](#).

ARTICLE II - OBJECT

Section 1. Object.

- a. E Ho'omau i ke Kūpa'a no ke Aloha i ka 'Āina (Continue to Be Steadfast in Love for the Land) These were the last words of Joseph Nāwahī to the Lāhui, before his passing on September 14th, 1896.
- b. To affirm the Hawaiian Patriotic League (Ka Hui Hawai'i Aloha 'Āina) founded on March 4th, 1893.
- c. To embrace and defend Hawaiian national identity.
- d. To educate our community about Hawaiian independence and the prolonged US occupation of Hawai'i.
- e. To move our community to action toward deoccupation and collective liberation.
- f. To honor the life and work of all Aloha 'Āina

Section 2. Motto. The motto of HAA Honolulu shall be:

[E Ho'omau i ke Kūpa'a no ke Aloha i ka 'Āina](#) (Continue to Be Steadfast in Love for the Land)

These were the last words of [Joseph Nāwahī](#) to the Lāhui, before his passing on September 14th, 1896.

Section 3. Song. The song of HAA Honolulu shall be: [Kaulana Nā Pua](#)

ARTICLE III - LEAGUE

Section 1. Charter. HAA Honolulu shall be a [District Branch](#) of the Hawaiian Patriotic League, hereinafter referred to as the [League](#). The acceptance of the [charter](#) by HAA Honolulu shall be a ratification and agreement to be bound by the constitution and bylaws of the League.

Section 2. Island Council. HAA Honolulu shall be under the jurisdiction of the Island Council

Section 3. Per Capita Dues. Per capita dues shall be paid annually by HAA Honolulu to the League and to the Island Council in the amount and on the date specified by the bylaws or other communications governing each organization.

ARTICLE IV - TAX STATUS

Section 1. Personal Gain. The income or net earnings of HAA Honolulu shall not inure to the benefit of any member or individual.

Section 2. Nonprofit. HAA Honolulu shall not be organized for profit and no part of the assets, income or earnings shall be used as dividends, or other withdrawals, or distributed to any of its members or officers, except for services actually rendered.

Section 3. Dissolution. Upon dissolution of HAA Honolulu, the officers shall, upon payment of all liabilities to the League and Island Council, dispose of all the remaining assets by distribution to a like fund or a foundation or organization that is organized and operated in the Hawaiian Kingdom exclusively for educational or charitable purposes.

ARTICLE V - Protections

Section 1. Political Endorsements. The League does not endorse or recommend any

candidates for elective political or public office. Accordingly, HAA Honolulu shall follow that policy.

Section 2. Personal or Political Gain. No officer or member of HAA Honolulu shall use it as a means of furthering the personal or political aspirations of any person.

Section 3. Alignment. HAA Honolulu shall only take part in activities that are consistent with these bylaws.

ARTICLE VI - DUTIES OF CHARTER

The duties of a District Branch chartered by the League are to:

1. Support the object of the League and designated Island Council.
2. Meet regularly (at least once every 3 months).
3. Elect officers and ensure that said officers assume their respective duties in accordance with the bylaws of the District Branch.
4. Send to every [Annual Convention](#) at least one delegate.
5. Submit reports to the Board of Directors of the League and of the Island Council as follows:
 - a. A branch roster of members and officers 30 days prior to the convening of the next Annual Convention together with the per capita dues.
 - b. A list of delegates and alternates to the Annual Convention, together with the registration fees, 30 days prior to the convening of the Annual Convention.
 - c. An annual report of the District Branch accomplishments.
 - d. Any other report as may be required by the Board of Directors of the League or Island Council.
6. Forward to their Island Council a report of the intent to dissolve (if applicable) 30 days prior to the anticipated day of dissolution.

ARTICLE VII - MEMBERS

Section 1. Eligibility. Any adult over 20 years of age who is a resident of O'ahu and who supports the object of HAA Honolulu shall be eligible for membership. Those wishing to join who have not attained the age of 20, but at least 10 years for 'Ōpio membership with the same requirement to support the object of HAA Honolulu. Any 'Ōpio members 19 years of age or younger pay the 'Ōpio rate.

Section 2. Admission. Applications must be submitted to the Secretary. Another member must sign the application for presentation to the membership at the next regular meeting. A two-thirds vote shall elect the candidate to membership.

Section 3. Dues. No person who wishes to be a member will be denied membership based on inability to pay dues.

The annual recommended membership dues shall be payable by January 31st of each year. individuals joining after June 30th shall be [assessed] half the regular dues.

Dues are as follows:

- Regular dues: \$48 annual
 - People with dependants can subtract \$10 from the \$80 membership fee for each dependent in their household, up to 5 dependents
- Student rate: \$25
- Opio rate: \$10
- Ohana rate for multi-adult households who wish to be members: 2 adults=\$150, and then add \$20 for each additional adult member in your household
- Affiliate rate: members of other branches on O'ahu - \$20

All members have equal kuleana to the branch regardless of dues

Section 4. Voting. Each Adult Membership equals one vote.

Section 5. Councils. Advisory Councils may be created as needed.

Section 6. Cancellation. Membership shall be canceled by death, nonpayment of dues, resignation in writing to the Secretary of HAA Honolulu, nonpayment of dues, or cessation of membership in the League.

ARTICLE VIII - OFFICERS

Section 1. Officers and Duties. The officers of HAA Honolulu shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer

Section 2. Nomination Procedure, Time of Elections. At the regular meeting held on the second Wednesday in February, a Nominating Committee of 3 members shall be elected by HAA Honolulu. It shall be the duty of this committee to nominate candidates for the offices to be filled at the annual meeting in March. The Nominating Committee shall report at the regular meeting in March. Before the election at the annual meeting in March, additional nominations from the floor shall be permitted.

Section 3. Ballot Election, Term of Office, Removal from Office. The officers shall be elected by ballot to serve for two years, or until their successors are elected, and their term of office shall begin at the close of the annual meeting at which they are elected. If there is only one candidate for a position, then a voice vote may elect. Officers may be removed from office by the membership as provided in the parliamentary authority.

Section 4. Office-Holding Limitations. All officers must physically reside on O'ahu. The President and Vice President shall be of Hawaiian ancestry. No member shall hold more than one office at a time, and no member shall be eligible to serve three consecutive terms in the same office.

Section 5. Vacancies. If there is a vacancy in the office of President, the Vice President will become the President. At the next regularly scheduled meeting, there will be an election for Vice President. If there is a vacancy in any other office, members will fill the vacancy at the next regular business meeting.

ARTICLE IX - DUTIES OF OFFICERS. These officers shall perform the duties prescribed by these bylaws or other acts of HAA Honolulu, and by the parliamentary authority adopted by HAA Honolulu. After every election the elected officers must (1) meet with the previous officers to gain signatory authority of all HAA Hon accounts (2) divide the Operating and Organizing Committee (Article 12) responsibilities with each officer joining at least 2-3 committees. Duties of officers shall be the following:

Section 1. President:

1. Shall preside at all meetings of the organization;
2. Supervise the work and activities of the organization;
3. Be the chief spokesperson for the organization;
4. Publicly speak on behalf of the organization;
5. Exercise caution, clarity, and good judgment consistent with the Object of the HAA Honolulu in expressing an opinion in a public forum, and;
6. May appoint an acting sergeant of arms, or other acting officers as needed.
7. Shall have the authority to sign checks or drafts for the withdrawal of funds from Branch account;
8. Shall have the authority to designate others to sign checks or drafts for the withdrawal of funds from Branch account temporarily, with approval from a quorum of the Executive Board and Committee Chairs. This body will determine the timeline of the designation, at the end of which, the designation is suspended.
9. The president and the treasurer shall provide oversight of the dues of members and have the authority to make final determinations relevant to individual membership dues.

Section 2. Vice-President:

1. Shall in the absence or inability of the President to perform his or her duties, act as and have the same authority as the President, and;
2. Have oversight for Standing Committees as directed by the President.
3. Shall familiarize self and officers with original by-laws as well as lexicon for legal terminology from historical by-laws.
4. Shall have the authority to sign checks or drafts for the withdrawal of funds from Branch account;

Section 3. The Secretary:

1. The Secretary shall be responsible for sending out the call for meetings, preparing the agenda in conjunction with the President, keeping the minutes, maintaining records, sending out the dues notices of lapsed dues correspondence, and working with the other officers. The secretary shall prepare, in advance of the regular meetings, the minutes for distribution at regular meetings for approval by the membership. The secretary shall, with approval of the President, send out via email or other means the minutes and agenda within one week of the next scheduled regular meeting.
2. Maintain an up-to-date membership and administrative roster of the organization, and shall deliver to his or her successor all books, papers, and such other articles belonging to the organization as may be in his or her possession within fourteen (14) days after leaving office.

3. Shall have the authority to sign checks or drafts for the withdrawal of funds from Branch account;

Section 4. The Treasurer:

1. Shall receive all funds paid in and belonging to the organization, providing receipts thereof, and depositing such funds in a bank, banks, or depositories as approved by the Executive Board;
2. Make disbursements as authorized by the Executive Board, and, together with the President or, in his or her absence, the Vice President, shall have authority to sign checks or drafts for the withdrawal of funds;
3. Have his or her accounts and books open at all times to the inspection of the Board, the President, and auditors as named by the board;
4. Submit a complete report of all monies received and disbursed to the Executive Board at each meeting;
5. Submit an annual report at the convention;
6. Deliver to his or her duly qualified successor all monies and other property in his or her possession or control, taking receipt thereof within (14) days after leaving office, and
7. Submit a final year-end report at the first board meeting following the end of the fiscal year.
8. Treasurer along with President shall provide oversight of the dues of members and have the authority to make final determinations relevant to individual membership dues.
9. Shall have the authority to sign checks or drafts for the withdrawal of funds from Branch account

Section 6. Archivist. The Archivist shall prepare a narrative account of the activities of HAA KLMA during his or her term of office, which, when approved by the assembly, will become a permanent part of the official history of HAA KLMA. The Archivist will also build the historical record of the Branch.

ARTICLE X - MEETINGS

Section 1. Regular Meetings. The regular meetings of HAA Honolulu shall be held on the second Thursday of each month unless otherwise ordered by HAA Honolulu. The hour and place shall be fixed by a standing rule.

Section 2. Annual Meetings. The regular meeting closest to the Spring Piko o Wakea (equinox) shall be held within Ka Piko o Wakea and shall be known as the annual meeting and shall be for the purpose of electing officers, receiving reports of officers and committees, and for any other business that may arise.

Section 3. Special Meetings. Special meetings may be called by the President or by the Executive Board or shall be called upon the written request of 5 members of HAA Honolulu. The purpose of the meetings shall be stated in the call, which shall be sent to all members at least 3 days before the meeting. The notice can be given by e-mail, postal mail, hand delivery, telephone, fax, or by all means currently available.

Section 4. Changes. When necessary, all the aforementioned meetings may be changed with notice given at least 3 days prior.

Section 5. Quorum. The quorum shall be 5 members of HAA Honolulu including at least two executive board members.

Section 6. Roll Call. At any meeting, a member may call for a roll call vote. The roll call vote will be included in the minutes.

ARTICLE XI - EXECUTIVE BOARD

Section 1. Board Composition. The officers of HAA Honolulu shall constitute the Executive Board.

Section 2. Board Duties and Powers. The Executive Board shall have general supervision of the affairs of HAA Honolulu between its business meetings, fix the hour and place of meetings, make recommendations to HAA Honolulu, and perform such other duties as are specified in these bylaws.

Section 3. Board Meetings. Unless otherwise ordered by the Board, regular meetings of The Executive Board shall be held quarterly in the first week of March, June, September, and December. Special meetings of the Board may be called by the President or shall be called upon the written request of 3 one members of the Board. The purpose of the special meetings shall be stated in the call, which shall be sent to all Board members at least 3 days before the meeting. The notice can be given by e-mail, postal mail, hand delivery or telephone. The quorum shall be a majority of the members of the Board. All business transacted shall require adoption by a majority vote of the entire Board. All Branch members are welcome to attend Board meetings through an online platform. Time-sensitive decisions may be made via electronic polling.

ARTICLE XII - OPERATING AND ORGANIZING COMMITTEES

Section 1. Operating and Organizing Committees. The standing committees of HAA Honolulu shall work together and are: The Program, Education, Membership, Finance, Auditing, Rules, Technology, Hawaiian Language, Publication, and Disciplinary.

- A. **Program Committee.** The Program Committee shall be responsible for planning the annual program of HAA Honolulu, community outreach, and educational activities. This committee's report shall be submitted to HAA Honolulu for approval at its regular meeting in September.
- B. **Education Committee.** The Education Committee shall be responsible for developing and implementing educational programs that promote the Objects of Hui Aloha Aina o Honolulu. The Committee's report shall be submitted to HAA Honolulu for approval at its regular meeting in September.
- C. **Membership Committee.** The Membership Committee shall be responsible for recruiting and maintenance of the membership of HAA Honolulu.
- D. **Finance Committee.** The Finance Committee shall include the Treasurer and shall be responsible for preparing a budget for the fiscal year beginning the first day of March, and submitting it to HAA Honolulu at its regular meeting in March. The Finance Committee may from time to time submit amendments to the budget for the current fiscal year, which may be adopted by a majority vote.
- E. **Auditing Committee.** An Auditing Committee shall be appointed by the President at the March meeting of HAA Honolulu, whose duty it shall be to audit the Treasurer's accounts at the close of the fiscal year and to report at the annual meeting. The treasurer will be prohibited from the Auditing Committee to ensure accountability.
- F. **Rules Committee.** The Rules Committee shall be responsible for maintaining the rules adopted by HAA Honolulu; articles of incorporation if applicable; registration of name, trademarks, and copyrights; compliance with applicable laws; and any other necessary legal protections.

- G. **Media and Technology Committee.** The Technology Committee shall be responsible for the technological needs of HAA Honolulu, including domain name, website, social media, online accounts, electronic meetings, and utilities.
- H. **Labor Committee.** The Labor Committee shall be responsible for developing and implementing research, education and organizing around a Hawai'i working people's movement that is rooted in principles and objectives of aloha 'āina.
- I. **Hawaiian Language Committee.** The Hawaiian Language Committee shall be responsible for developing Hawaiian language versions of rules adopted by HAA Honolulu, and for communications of HAA Honolulu, and all other means of perpetuating the Hawaiian language and culture.
- J. **Publication Committee.** The Publication Committee shall be responsible for printed communications of HAA Honolulu, including logos, artwork, event fliers, brochures, signs, and banners.
- K. **Committee on Security and Accountability.** The Committee on Security and Accountability shall be responsible for being alert to threats to security or issues of accountability, for investigating them, for introducing all necessary resolutions, for managing the issue for HAA Honolulu, and for reporting to the President and Vice President, except in the case that the President or Vice President are subject of the investigation. This committee should be large enough that a subcommittee can perform the confidential investigation as prescribed by Security and Accountability protocols.

Section 2. Other Committees. Other committees, standing or special, shall be established as directed by HAA Honolulu to carry on its work.

Section 3. President's Ex-Officio Committee Membership. The President shall be *ex officio* a member of all committees except the Nominating Committee and any disciplinary committees.

Section 4. Board Members. Board members will report back on the progress of each committee in Article 12 at every Executive Board Meeting.

ARTICLE XIII - ELECTRONIC MEETINGS

Section 1. Description. Board meetings and committee meetings may be called as electronic meetings at which some or all of the participating members communicate with the others through electronic means such as the Internet or telephone. Such alternative meetings shall provide, at a minimum, conditions of opportunity for simultaneous aural communication among all participating members equivalent to those of meetings held in one room or area. Meetings may be by videoconference or teleconference (including over the Internet) so long as all persons participating can hear each other at the same time (and, if by a videoconference, can see each other as well). Electronic meetings shall provide the option of closed captioning whenever possible.

Section 2. Notice. The notice of an electronic meeting must include an adequate description of how to participate in it. A central location may be designated in the notice for members who wish to attend in person.

Section 3. Non Members. Non Members shall not participate in electronic meetings unless properly invited by HAA Honolulu to do so.

Section 4. Absentees. For board meetings and committee meetings not called as electronic meetings, the body may choose to allow or disallow such participation by members who are not present in person.

ARTICLE XIV - PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Section 1. Parliamentary Authority. The rules contained in the current edition of [*Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised*](#) shall govern HAA Honolulu at the discretion of the executive board. To which they are applicable and in which they are consistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order HAA Honolulu may adopt.

Section 2. Meetings Conducted in Hawaiian. The rules and terminology contained in the current edition of [*Nā Lula Hālāwai: A Parliamentary Guide to Conducting Meetings in Hawaiian*](#) shall guide HAA Honolulu at the discretion of the executive board. to which they are applicable and in which they are consistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order HAA Honolulu may adopt ensuring that all members present have a clear understanding of the discussions and decisions being made.

ARTICLE XV - CODE OF ETHICS

The [code of ethics](#) adopted by the League shall be the code of ethics of HAA Honolulu and its individuals as follows:

Any member of the HAA Honolulu or of its Executive Board who may commit an act violating the spirit and purposes of HAA Honolulu may be summoned before the Executive Board and upon determination by the EC, be expelled from the HAA Honolulu. Hence, the following three items described below will be used to evaluate membership acts for the purpose of summoning and determination.

Debate Issues, Not Personalities One of the most important rules of debate is that the proposal, not the member, is the subject of debate. Vigorous debate about the merits of a motion is central to the very idea of a deliberative assembly. When the arguments on all sides are fully aired, the group is most likely to come to a wise decision. Criticizing the opponent's reasoning, however, is different from criticizing the opponent personally. When a motion is pending, you may attack the idea or likely results of the proposal in strong terms, but you must avoid personalities! Under no circumstances can you attack or question the motives of another member. Assume Good Faith

Assuming good faith (AGF) is a fundamental principle relied on by HAA Honolulu. It is the assumption that members' discussion, comments, questions, etc. are made in good faith to try to help the organization, not hurt it. This guideline does not require that members continue to assume good faith in the presence of obvious evidence to the contrary nor does assuming good faith prohibit discussion and criticism. Rather, members should not attribute the actions being criticized to malice unless there is specific evidence of such. When disagreement occurs, try to the best of your ability to explain and resolve the problem, not cause more conflict, and so give other members the opportunity to reply in kind. Consider whether a dispute stems from different perspectives, and look for ways to reach consensus.

Ho'oponopono as the foundation Mental cleansing: family conferences in which relationships were set right (ho'oponopono) through prayer, discussion, confession, repentance, and mutual restitution and forgiveness are to be the foundation for all debate, actions, and conduct.

ARTICLE XVI - INCORPORATION

The Executive Board may incorporate HAA Honolulu under the laws of the Hawaiian Kingdom.

ARTICLE XVII - DISSOLUTION

HAA Honolulu may be dissolved by a two-thirds vote at any regular meeting, provided that notice has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting. All outstanding bills shall be paid, and the remaining money shall be returned to the members or, by a vote of the members, may be given to a charity of their choice.

ARTICLE XVIII - AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting of HAA Honolulu by a two-thirds vote, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing at the previous regular meeting or has been sent to each member at least 14 days prior to the meeting at which it will be considered. Sent notice can be given by e-mail, postal mail, hand delivery, telephone, fax or all means currently available.

Source: "Nā Mele o Hawai'i Nei" by Elbert and Mahoe - Written in January 1893, published in 1895, this hīmeni (hymn) opposed the annexation of the Hawaiian Islands to the United States. The original title was "Mele 'Ai Pohaku" ("The Stone-Eating Song"), and is also known as "Mele Aloha 'Āina" ("Patriot's Song"). This song was composed as Ellen Wright Prendergast was sitting in the garden of her father's house in Kapālama, O'ahu. Members of the Royal Hawaiian Band visited her and voiced their unhappiness at the takeover of the Hawaiian Kingdom. They begged her to put their feelings of rebellion to music.
